
HISTORY The Catholic church celebrates Epiphany on January 6, however in the United States it

usually celebrated on the first Sunday after January I. The Epiphany is the 12th day after Christmas and ends the Christmas season. In many countries this celebration is a holy day of obligation, so we are required to attend mass.

The word epiphany means "appearance" or "manifestation". On this day we celebrate Christ's appearance as a baby to the adorning wise men, or magi. In the gospel of Matthew we hear about Melchior, Caspar, and Balthazar, the three wise men, who were told of Christ's birth and followed the star to find him. They traveled to Bethlehem bringing with them gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. These precious gifts show that they know they were visiting the savior of the world, Jesus Christ.


